

FEI Requirements to enter various FEI categories of competition at Sydney CDI

These requirements apply when horses are competing at FEI sanctioned events held in Australia.

(a) CDN: National competitions (CDN PSG, GP, Inter II, Advanced, Young Horse)

(b) for horses being registered for the first time with the FEI. *Owners who apply for an FEI Passport do not need a National Passport.

Notes:

CDI-Y, CDI U25, CDI-J, CDI-P horses/ponies may get an FEI Passport but it is not compulsory. CDI-Y, CDI U25, CDI-J, CDI-P horses/ponies that were registered with the FEI prior to 1 Jan 2017 must have their EA horse registration papers with them at the arrival inspection.

Q. If your horse is competing for the first time in a CDI 3, what does it need to compete?*

**A: An FEI Passport + FEI registration
OR
An EA National Passport & FEI recognition card + FEI registration**

Q: If your horse or pony is competing for the first time in a CDI-Y, U-25 or CDI-P/J and has not been registered before with the FEI, what does it need to compete?

A: An EA National Passport + FEI registration OR an FEI Passport + FEI registration

CDI-P Update 2020

As at January 2020

EA Measuring System applies in place of the FEI Measurement system for ponies in Australia. The FEI will allow Australian ponies to compete with an EA Measurement Card when competing at CDI-P competitions in Australia.
